*RECIPE

APRICOT LOAF

175g (6oz) Dried Apricots chopped	250ml/8fl oz Water
175g (6oz) Caster Sugar	175g (6oz) White Flora
225g (8oz) Wholemeal Flour	2 Eggs beaten
1/2 teaspoon Ground Cinnamon	Pinch of Ground Cloves
1/2 teaspoon Salt	1 teaspoon Bicarbonate of Soda

METHOD

- * Apricots into a Saucepan with the Water, Sugar, White Flora, Spices and Salt
- * Bring slowly to the boil, stirring, and simmer gently for 5 minutes
- * Remove from heat and cool
- * Sift the Flour and Bicarbonate of Soda into a bowl
- * Add the Apricot mixture and Eggs and mix well
- * Pour into a greased and bottom-lined 1kg/2lb loaf tin
- * Bake in a pre-heated oven (180oC/350oF/Gas Mark 4) for about 1 hour or until firm to the touch
- * Cool on a wire rack
